STEWARDSHIP – January 8, 2017 – Epiphany of Our Lord "Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11) The image of the Magi kneeling before the infant Jesus and opening their treasure chests for Him is an image that we should all try to follow all year long. In gratitude for all that we have been given, we are called to generously share all our gifts, not just the ones we pick and choose. God wants us to be the most generous with that one thing that means the most to us.

EPIPHANY – A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE by Bud Ozar: Today's Gospel tells us "all Jerusalem" was upset because "King Herod was deeply troubled." A similar ripple effect happens in families; one person's negative attitude can affect the whole family. It you want a peaceful and joyful home it must start with you. Be peaceful and joyful!

THEME: GOD LAVISHES UPON US GIFTS BEYOND OUR

MERIT. Today's readings demonstrate the gratuitous nature of God's love for humanity. Recognizing this benevolence, we, along with the Magi, prostrate ourselves and pay homage by offering our supreme gifts – our faith, hope and love – in the service of our generous, loving God.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, the prophet reminds Israel that God's glory will shine on them. They will be a people to be admired by nations and kings. Saint Paul recounts for the Ephesians that Gentiles are co-heirs and copartners in the promise of Jesus Christ in the Gospel. The Gospel recounts the Magi's visit to pay homage to the newborn baby Jesus.


